

HOW DO I CITE COPYRIGHT-PROTECTED MATERIAL THAT I AM (LEGALLY) USING? WHAT ABOUT CITING IMAGES?

It's important to ensure that all copyright protected materials used for teaching are cited appropriately. This is relevant to all types of materials - text, film, images etc.



CITING COPYRIGHT-PROTECTED MATERIAL



Follow citation guidelines for your discipline. e.g. APA , Harvard, Chicago etc.

If materials are used with permission from the copyright owner, say 'Used with permission from...'



Cite the source of the material - e.g. book/journal title. Include the name of the creator/author.

For work from the internet, including images, the source cited should at least include the URL.



IMAGE CITATIONS IN POWERPOINT SLIDES



Citing images in Powerpoint etc. is part of 'sufficient acknowledgement' of author/creator - required by law

Readers should be able to find the source of the image, and the image itself, from the citation



Citations should be given next to images on slides, or in a separate reference list

If most images are from a single source, include a general statement to this effect
